MRCS Course Outline

This new course has been specifically designed to meet the requirements of surgical core trainees who are about to sit the MRCS Part B OSCE exam.

Tutorial/viva-based small-group teaching will cover anatomy, pathology, physiology, critical care, principles of surgery and surgical specialty subjects. Teaching and examination will be provided by senior anatomy, anaesthetic and surgical faculty. Human cadaveric prosections will be used to demonstrate key clinically relevant anatomical topics.

Delegates will be exposed to exam-style OSCE conditions for practice with summative assessment as well as formative feedback opportunities.

The course is limited to a maximum of 16 delegates on application.
